

To explain what 'the gospel' means and explore what its effect on our lives might be.







Why Do Suffering and Evil Seem So Wrong?













More Than Mere Religion

"[M]any people today assume that Christianity is ... a religion, a moral system, a philosophy. In other words, they assume that Christianity is about advice. But it wasn't and it isn't. Christianity is, simply, good news. It is the news that something has happened as a result of which the world is a different place ... One can debate the merits of a religion, moral system, or philosophy, but a news event is discussed in a different way. Either the event happened or it didn't; if it did happen, either it means what people say it means or it doesn't "

Motivation is fear and insecurity	Motivation is grateful joy
When things go wrong, I get angry at God or myself; being good should result in a comfortable life.	When things go wrong, I struggle, but I know that all my punishment fell on Jesus. I also know God loves me and is with me through trials.
My identity is based on performance and image: threats to my self image must be destroyed at all costs.	My identity is not based on my performance but on God's love for me in Christ.


Group Prayer


With those around you in twos and threes ...


- 1. Pray for each other as you head home that God would create opportunities in your workplaces, friendship groups, families etc. to talk about your faith.
