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

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Pointers & Breadcrumbs: 'Cause of the Cosmos'

- <u>Premise 1:</u> Whatever begins to exist has a cause of its existence.
- Premise 2: The universe began to exist.
 - Second Law of Thermodynamics (Entropy)
 - Universe is expanding
 - Radiation afterglow from Big Bang explosion
 - Great Galaxy Seeds
 - Einstein's Theory of General Relativity



Pointers & Breadcrumbs: 'Cause of the Cosmos'

- Spaceless because it created space
- Timeless because it created time
- Immaterial because it created matter
- Extremely powerful because it created out of nothing
- <u>Intelligent</u> because the creation event & universe are extremely precise
- <u>Personal</u> because it made a choice to make something out of nothing

- Personal James 4:8





When you assume there's **good**, you assume there's such a thing as a **moral law** on the basis of which to **differentiate** between good and evil.


But if you assume a moral law, you must assume a **moral Law Giver**, but that's Who you're trying to disprove and not prove.






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
