

• Atheism = This universe is all that exists — mass energy is fundamental


- **Theism** = There is something beyond the physical

Introduction


• 'Proof'

 - Food we eat?






History of Science

What changed?

- 1800's the Enlightenment
- New theories on the origin & evolution of life emerged
- Worldview of *scientific materialism* began to dominate thinking about the meaning of science

Confusion: What is Science?

- Investigation of the natural world through various means of observation and experimentation.
- Setting up hypotheses, testing them, then accepting, rejecting, or modifying them.
- Making inferences to the best explanation.


Fine Tuning of the Universe for Life



Faith in Science


- Wrong definition of 'faith' as 'blind faith'

Faith in Atheism?


Faith in atheism is not compatible with faith in science!

"If Dawkins is right that we are the product of mindless unguided natural processes, then he is given a strong reason to doubt the reliability of human cognitive faculties and therefore inevitably to doubt the validity of any belief they produce, including Dawkins' own science and atheism. His biology and his belief in naturalism would therefore appear to be at war with each other in a conflict that has nothing at all to do with God"



Faith in Atheism?

The point:

- If our minds are the product of blind, random chemical mechanisms, then why trust them at all?
- Atheism takes a huge amount of faith!
